Program Overview: Ethics in psychology has historically been consensus-based. The Virginia Board of Psychology is charged with ensuring public safety via the regulation of psychology, and is committed to ongoing dialogue with licensees in furthering that process. This workshop will provide an overview of the disciplinary process in Virginia and provide examples of common disciplinary problems, and will discuss the relatively new Sanctioning Reference Points project. It will also explore emerging and controversial topics in regulation, including social media, telehealth and licensure portability, conversion therapy for minors, participation in torture, and recent court decisions regarding licensing boards. It will also describe the Virginia Healthcare Workforce Data project (the survey one encounters upon licensure renewal), which has been recognized as a model among states.

Discussion and debate will be encouraged throughout the workshop. The board is in the process of reviewing the Standards of Practice in our current regulations. Participants are encouraged to review that two-page document, which may be found at this linkhttps://www.dhp.virginia.gov/psychology/leg/Psychology_01272016.doc, and consider whether any additions or clarifications might be helpful.

Learning objectives: Participants will be able to:

- 1. Describe the disciplinary process for psychology in Virginia
- 2. Describe two areas for additional regulation or clarification that are being discussed by the board.
- 3. Describe a current proposal to facilitate interjurisdictional practice via telepsychology.

Speaker: Dr. Stewart is currently chair of the Virginia Board of Psychology, where he has served for six years including as chair of the Regulatory Committee. He has practiced as a clinical psychologist at Western State Hospital in Staunton, Va. for nearly 30 years. He also holds an appointment as Visiting Asst. Prof. in the Univ. of Virginia Dept. of Psychiatric Medicine. Dr. Stewart received his BA in Psychology from UVa and his PhD from the Univ. of Texas at Austin. He has been active in professional organizations for many years and is a past president of the Virginia Psychological Association.
