Program Overview:

Want to up-level your clinical work to include the most significant part of what really drives therapeutic results? Through advancements in neuropsychology we now understand how to address implicit memories to change the codes that drive behavior, mood, relationship strategies and even physiological realities like inflammation, chronic pain and vertigo. An overview of the many different modalities that can be utilized to rework the data of implicit memory will be presented. Stories of clinical application and illustration will be shared throughout. Participants will walk away with a table of resources that can directly change implicit memory as well as links for further study and training.
