Summary/Goals of our presentation are as follows: Provide attendees with an understanding of the legal requirements for and ethical considerations in responding to subpoenas; offer attendees a guideline for responding to legal demands within the constraints of HIPAA; define and differentiate the roles mental health professionals may play in litigated cases and the nature and scope of information each role can validly provide; and demonstrate effective testimony in court, as an expert or fact witness, while avoiding common ethical pitfalls

11:00 am – 12:00 pm Cognitive Behavioral Analysis System of Psychotherapy: (1 Hour CE) Treatment for Persistent Depressive Disorder (1 Hour CE)

Persistent or chronic depression is one of the most challenging psychological disorders to treat, and traditional therapies and pharmacotherapies have provided only limited ability to provide full recovery for these patients. We will provide an introduction to the theory and practice of Cognitive Behavioral Analysis System of Psychotherapy (CBASP), an evidenced-based third-wave psychotherapy for persistent depression. CBASP is the only psychotherapy model developed specifically for persistent depressive disorder, with clinical trials demonstrating its effectiveness. This workshop will provide an introduction to the theory of CBASP and hands-on practice and role-play using CBASP techniques. Video or live demonstrations will be provided prior to role-play of each strategy. CBASP targets interpersonal avoidance and teaches coping skills by promoting felt safety with the therapist, while increasing the patient's ability to recognize and begin to change the consequences of their behavior on others (interpersonal mindfulness), termed 'perceived functionality' in CBASP.

Due to the rapidly evolving technological world psychologists are increasingly asked about the impact of technology on humans. Specifically, parents are asking for guidance on raising children in the age of social media. This training will cover two objectives: (1) The helpful and harmful impact of social media on children (2) How psychologists can help parents facilitate healthy connections with their children to mitigate the negative aspects of social media.

10:00 am – 12:00 pm Psychological Concerns of High Risk Pregnancy & the Impact on Human Connection. (2 Hours CE) ~ Keith Bernardo, Ph.D.

Pregnancies that are termed high-risk can be both physically and psychological fraught for the parents. This talk will cover what constitutes a high-risk pregnancy, covering types of complications and their frequency. Potential impacts of maternal psychological states and the impact on in utero development will be discussed, as well as bio-behavioral implications of maternal distress and the cascade of events prenatally. Further, this presentation will cover maternal and paternal attachment, and maternal fetal attachment and the ramifications that may occur if there is difficulty attaching to the fetus both during gestation, delivery, and beyond. Case studies will be presented, and the need for this parent-child connection will be discussed in town-hall forum style.


